You can also search for information on other tests by clicking on Health Topics at the homepage, and then selecting L from the resulting alphabetical display and following the link for Laboratory Tests.

This comprehensive guide provides a basic understanding of the diagnostic procedures and tools used by physicians, hospitals, and commercial laboratories. Organized alphabetically, it presents information on more than 1,000 commonly prescribed tests and procedures. Each entry includes a description of the test, preparation required, the procedure itself, the reference range, and what abnormal values may signify. There is also an extensive glossary of medical terms.
